

Translation of legal papers

In prior

All of your UK documents need to be taken by you to the Legalization Department of the Foreign & Commonwealth Office so that an Apostille can be applied.

This enables your documents to be recognized as legal public documents in Greece.

All documentation needs to be certified (all originals, not copies) by the British Legalization office (come in contact with your Ministry of Foreign Affairs) with the Hague Apostille Seal. The stamp is needed for every document mentioned earlier for the authentication of the documents.

Standard Documentation 150 Euro

- Full Birth Certificate (both parties).
- Certificates of No Impediment to Marriage (both parties).

Local Registrar will be able to provide you with these documents and you will need about a month for them to be issued.

Important notes:

1. In the box marked "District and Country where your marriage was solemnized" you must enter **Dimos Kos, Kos Greece.**
2. The Certificate of No Impediment to Marriage must not be issued more than 3 months before the day of your wedding.

Additional Documentation 35 Euro / per document

- Divorced: Decree Absolute
- Names have been changed: Deed poll
- Adoption certificates if you are entered into the registry of adopted children
- Adoption Order if you have a short Birth certificate
- Death certificate of deceased spouse
- Marriage certificate(s) to deceased spouse(s)
- If under 18: a Statutory declaration of consent off a parent or guardian, signed and stamped by a solicitor

After the wedding

Please note that as your Marriage Certificate will be in Greek, we do offer the translation from Greek to English as well, for 35 Euro / per document.

In case you will be departing shortly after your Wedding, there will be an additional fee for a courier service to send the documents to your home address.
