

Legal Requirements

The law in Grenada requires that the couple must be at least 21 years of age and staying at the resort for 3 FULL business days prior to the ceremony date. The day of arrival does not count as one of the business days. There is an express cost payable to expedite the processing of your marriage license if you wish to be married before the required residency period above. If one of the parties is under 21 years old, evidence of consent from parents is required in the form of a sworn affidavit stamped by a notary public.

DOCUMENTATION:

All documents must be received at least 30 days prior to your wedding ceremony in order to begin the application process.

Clear NOTARIZED copies of the below documents must be submitted in order to hold your ceremony on property:

- Passports
- Original birth certificates
- Sworn Affidavit confirming single status (or letter from Lawyer, Registry or Clergy), attesting that neither party has not been previously married and certificated stamp fee
- Decree Absolute, for each divorced party
- Death certificate of former spouse if widowed
- Previous marriage certificate
- Adoption certificate
- Legal proof if name was changed by Deed Poll (all legal documents or identification must have the same or correct spelling)

Please note that the wedding couple will have to go to the ministry for the wedding license application. Transportation to and from the ministry is included in the legal requirements cost.

The collection of wedding certificate happens one (1) week after / five (5) working days after the ceremony. If you depart the island/resort prior to this, there is the option of mailing the certificate to you.
